Knowstone Parish Hall Annual Activity Report May 2024 to May 2025

It has been a busy 12 months for our Parish Hall Committee and the Hall has been in good use by the parishioners. Over the past year there have been visible improvements to the Hall – most notably a new larger weatherproof shed, lightweight staging, a modern sound system, retaping of the Hall floor for badminton and skittles, and work progressing on the kitchen relocation project.

We are fortunate to have committed Trustees in our team who are willing to take time from their busy lives for the benefit of their community. We have had a few changes to the team. Cath Whatcott and Phil Dey left the team after being valued team members for the past six years. We were extremely grateful for their service to our community. Also, Evelyn Fitzgerald, who joined us at the beginning of 2024 sadly resigned during the year. However, we welcomed Paul Stevens and AJ Wilson into the team. However, we have successfully delivered 27 events during the past 12 months.

We continue to use the Knowstone Facebook (FB) page for advertising and sharing posts across similar local FB pages. Gill has also created a network of contacts across neighboring parishes to share ideas and ensure we do not run events concurrently. Last September she organised and hosted a **Communities Together Event** at our Hall to share ideas and knowledge. The evening was very successful and was attended by trustees from Molland, Oakford, Anstey, Brushford and Rackenford.

Other uses of the Hall

The Hall is also used for regular events organised by various parishioners. These include:

- Pilates, Yoga and Keep Fit classes
- Book club
- Craft and Chat
- Gardening Club
- Pickle Ball

Parishioners have also used the Hall for other events such as meetings, a Halloween party and a Children's party. Sadly, over the winter months we had four wakes for much loved parishioners held at the Hall.

Kitchen Project

After the Batsworthy fund reopened and our grant applications for the kitchen project were approved, we are finally making progress. A big thank you to Kim and Martin for submitting the applications and leading the project. The old storage space is now empty and works to transform it into a new kitchen have started. Kim secured the kitchen units and appliances at a competitive price, so these were purchased in December and stored in the Committee room. The external doors have been replaced, and the floor is prepared for plumbing and flooring installation. In addition to Martin, both Paul and AJ have been putting a lot of hours to get this – a big thank you! They continue working alongside contractors who will do the building, electrical and kitchen installation work. We hope to complete the works early autumn 2025.

Other Improvements

We have also been successful in securing grants from the Batsworthy Fund for the following improvements:

- Metal shed replacing the smaller old wooden one. This was essential as part of the kitchen project allowing a safe space to store the contents of the old store room.
- New lightweight staging to replace the old wooden staging. This is modular and can be stored in the new shed leaving the main hall space free.
- New sound system replacing the old one which required considerable effort to set up and, space for storage.
 The new one has eight speakers installed around the Hall with a control unit in one corner. We are donating the old system to our Parish Church.

The library corner in the Committee Room is moving to the Parish Church. This way the books are always accessible to parishioners and not dependent on the Hall being open.

The Committee strives to raise funds towards the Hall's maintenance and running costs whilst providing a variety of activities to appeal to as wide an age range as possible, to ensure support for the hall as a community asset from across the Parish.

Here's to a successful year ahead full of fun and beneficial activities. We are always looking forward to welcoming new team members and anyone who wants to come and get involved in any of our events and activities.
